

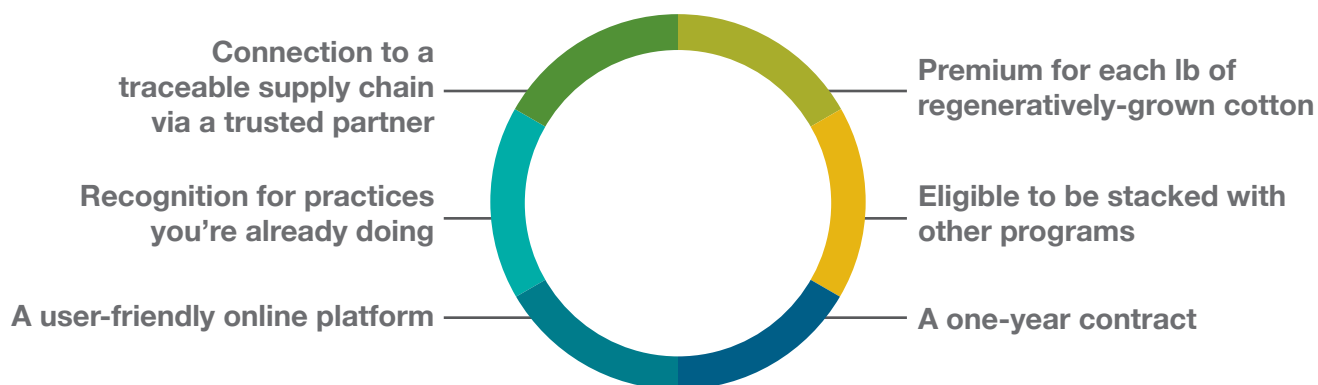

## Eligible locations

Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia.



## To enroll:

1. Sign a contract to sell cotton bales to Cargill between May 1 and December 01, 2025.
2. Work with a Cargill rep to enter information about your cover cropping, tillage, and production practices.
3. Receive a premium per pound of cotton contracted and produced on land where regenerative practices are in place.
